The Catharine Littlefield Greene Chapter identified six War of 1812 Veterans buried in historic Oak Grove Cemetery in St. Marys, Georgia. None were in the USD1812 database. Research was done on all and all were approved for grave markings and were added to the grave data base for War of 1812 Veterans.

All six were in the same detachment, Lt. Colonel William Scott's Detachment. They were:

Joseph Bachlott—1st Lt., son of John Bachlott, Rev. War Soldier, born in VA

Lewis Bachlott—private, son of John Bachlott, see above

Robert J. Deloney, private, born 1797

John Gray—private, large landholder on Cumberland Island

Thomas Ellis Hardee—private, later a murder victim in St. Marys

William Scott—Lt. Colonel, leader of this Detachment

A Grave Marking ceremony was held on December 14, 2015, with St. Marys Mayor John Morrissey and City Commissioners Sam Colville and Linda Williams in attendance.
